## Maths

By the end of Year 5, children are expected to know all of their tables up to x12, including inverse division calculations. As a school, we have introduced Times Tables Rock stars to help the children become quick and confident at recalling their multiplication and division facts.

They can access their account at home on a laptop, tablet or smart phone (with parental permission).

## Reading

We encourage reading for pleasure at Exwick, and reading regularly with an adult or independently. This can be through library books, books from home, newspapers, magazines or online articles. The children have their Reading Journals in which they are expected to record what they have read at least 3x per week. Reading Journals will be signed off each Monday morning by the class teacher, and if children have read 3+ times in the previous week, they will receive a raffle ticket to enter into the termly Read To Succeed draw, where exciting prizes can be won!
