Please find below some ideas for guiding your child's learning at home. Please encourage your child to **complete one or more** of these activities, **with your support**.



This week, our story is called 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar'. In the story, the caterpillar eats something different every day of the week.



- Keep a diary of the food you eat every day. Use your letters and sounds to write the words.
- Perhaps you could try some new foods this week.
- Indicate which foods you like the best

with a smiley face. Can you say why you liked them the best?



The Very Hungry Caterpillar enjoys eating fruit and vegetables to keep healthy.



- What else can we do to keep ourselves healthy? Can you talk with your family about the different ways they keep fit and healthy?
- If they go to the gym or do a sport, could they show you some of the exercises and perhaps you could try them out.


In maths we have been working on 'using money'.



- We have been using a range of different coins including 1p, 2p, 5p and 10p to buy different items from our teachers and our peers. Do you have any of these coins at home? Could you use them to 'buy' something?
- We have also learnt the names of various other coins we might see, maybe you could help a grown-up to buy something the next time they visit a shop. Can you help make the correct amount?

We have been exploring the life-cycle of butterflies, and how caterpillars turn into butterflies.

- We know that butterflies are almost always symmetrical, can you create your own symmetrical butterfly?
- You might like to draw, colour, paint or build your butterfly. Can you make it symmetrical?
- Will your butterfly be stripy, spotty or something different?
- We'd love to see your symmetrical butterflies!



In addition, Reception children should continue to practise reading and writing the 'tricky words' we have been learning.

To practise spelling these words, you could play the game - **Look, cover, write, check!**

Look at the word and remember it.

Cover the word so that you cannot see it.

Write the word on a piece of paper.

Check the word you have written to see if you remembered it correctly.
